This workbook is designed to teach children as young as five—and as old as ninety-five—the Greek alphabet. It's easy and fun!

Koine ("coin-ay") Greek is what we call the Greek of the Bible. It's the version of classical Greek that people spoke in the days of the New Testament. While, at first, you may think the letters seem like strange alien writing, you and your children will quickly learn them—and probably really enjoy it, like you're learning a secret code!


