- Keep Feet Still-Student will practice standing on a coin to keep his feet still while talking.

AUDIENCE SKILL: Listening attentively (mouth closed & ears open).

Week 5 (Sept. 10): History

Student will memorize and recite one historical quote for his classmates, and explain why he likes it. SPEAKING SKILL:

- Volume—Student should practice using the right volume for the audience and room size. He should "Do unto others as he would have them to do him;" do they like it when a speaker is so quiet that they cannot hear, or too loud??
- Keep Feet Still-Student will practice standing on a coin to keep his feet still while talking.

AUDIENCE SKILL: Listening attentively (mouth closed & ears open).

Week 6 (Sept. 17): Foreign Language

Student will memorize and recite something from a foreign language for his classmates, give the English translation, and explain why he likes it.

SPEAKING SKILL:

- Posture—Student should stand up straight through the crown of his head. He should not lean against whatever happens to be nearby.
