

The "Donation of Constantine" was probably forged at about the time of the Donation of Pepin the Short.





This is a close-up of the Aztec Sun Stone; it was on top of their pyramid, and people would be sacrificed on top of this stone. When the Spanish overthrew the Aztecs, they took this stone and buried it upside down, because they had witnessed so much evil done on it... The Sun god's tongue is a knife, likely representing a thirst for blood. On either side of its face, jaguar paws are clutching hearts. In the ritual sacrifices, captured warriors were sacrificed by the priest cutting out the victim's heart while it was still beating, and then decapitating the victim. First the victim's head was rolled down all of those horrible steps, and then the victim's body.











Thomas Aquinas was the intermediary link between the old Christian Europe and the increasingly secularized, humanist Western world. During Thomas' life, there was great tension between the conservative faction of the church and the new humanism that was creeping into the medieval church. As a Dominican priest, Thomas took it upon himself to counteract the growing fear of the Aristotelian ideologies, to resolve the tension developing between the secular university and the church. Gifted with a tremendous mind, Thomas set out to create a comfortable synthesis between humanist philosophy and God-sourced revelatory truth. ...

Aquinas' magnum opus is *Summa Theologiae*, a highly systematized theology. ...much of his teaching may be helpful for the defense of an orthodox, Trinitarian faith. ...the first article was terribly flawed. ... Aquinas proposed two systems of knowledge: the one sacred and the other secular (or philosophical). This broke away from the old Augustinian view of knowledge, summed up in the Latin phrase "*Credo ut intelligam*," or, "I believe in order to understand." ... Aquinas broke from this view when he proposed a second form of knowledge "different in kind" from that obtained in Scripture.






































Ivan the Great was the grand duke of Moscow (Moscovy). He began his campaign of conquering neighboring states by launching a war against Novgorod, a prosperous republic with a long history (pictured). He subjected many other neighboring states to his rule, and later also changed the government of Moscow itself to an autocratic rule, stripping away the rights of the lesser magistrates throughout his territories. He freed his lands from attacks from warlike Tartar and Kazan khans (Mohammedan rulers), but lived peaceably with the Mohammedan rulers of the Crimea and Turkey. After his first wife died, he married a princess from the line of the imperial throne of Constantinople (Constantinople had fallen when Ivan was only a youth). "Orthodox canonists were [already] inclined regard the Moscovite grand dukes as successors of the Byzantine emperors." Hence, the Russian rulers after this time came to be called emperors and were given the title of tsar, or czar (caesar). (Encyclopedia Britannica, 1943)




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
































"Of all of the modern Nephilim [apostates], the most imposing figure may very well have been the French philosopher Jean-Jacques Rouseau. He was the pivotal philosopher who gave birth to the modern age, which historians generally agree began in 1820. ... Rouseau 'had more effect upon posterity than any other writer or thinker of that eighteenth century in which writers were more influential than they had ever been before.' Rouseau's fingerprints are all over the institutions of the modern world. ... The political, social, and educational institutions that provide the modern context for life on planet earth were very much defined by this man. ... Karl Marx's communist ideologies, including elimination of private property ownership, initially appeared in Rousseau's Social Contract.

"If ideas have consequences, it was the ideas of Jean-Jacques Rousseau that brought about the spirit of revolution, the reign of terror, the guillotine, the forced redistribution of wealth, and 40,000 dead bodies [of the French Revolution, led by Rousseau acolyte, Robespierre]. Regrettably, the horror did not end with Robespierre's execution. 'Robespierre died, but folly has a virulence that outlasts its inventor. He inspired more Communes, more Voices of Virtue, more Lenins and Castros and Maos, more muder and hatred, more death and misery, than any other of the Sacred Fools that have emerged to


plague honest men.' Rousseau was to Robespierre what Marx was to Lenin and Mao. First come the ideas, and then the consequences. What was it that Jesus Christ told us? 'Ye shall know them by their fruits.'...

"Émile may have been the most damaging of all [of Rousseau's works]. ... When Rousseau told fathers they owed 'their children to the state,' he laid out a fundamental social view that would dominate for the next three centuries. ... You would have had to search long and hard to find any small city state over the 4,000 years of world history leading up to Rousseau's life that mandated a compulsory attendance law in order to indoctrinate hundreds of millions (if not billions) of citizens in statist ideologies. Rousseau's ideas provided the fertile ground that the statist educational theory needed to thrive in the 19th and 20th centuries. This philosopher's vision for staist education found acceptance in Prussia at around the same time of the publication of Émile. It would take another century before America incorporated these compulsory attendance laws—the modern statist system was finally in place when the state of Mississippi finally adopted the law in 1917. ...

"Twenty years before *Émile*, a life-changing event occurred with the philosopher when his live-in girlfriend birthed his first child. Immediately, Rousseau bundled up the child and deposited it on the steps of an orphanage. This happened to be during the dead of winter, a time when babies disposed of in such a way had a scant chance of survival. In subsequent years, the wretch had a total of five children and each received the same derelict treatment."

























STALIN'S GENOCIDAL FAMINE OF 1932-1933 DEATH TOLL: AT LEAST 4 MILLION UKRAINIANS

Holodomor (death by hunger, in Ukrainian) is the starvation of millions of Ukrainians in 1932–33 as a result of Soviet policies



- In Stalin's plan, rapid industrialization was supposed to propel the USSR into modernity.
- Collectivization of agriculture was enforced to feed the growing urban population and to purchase factory equipment from abroad.
- Ukrainian peasants had a strong tradition of private farming and resisted collectivization, posing a threat to the Soviet state.

FALL 1932 - SUMMER 1933


Ukrainian peasants were given impossibly high quotas for the amount of grain their villages were required to contribute to the Soviet state.

Because these quotas couldn't be fulfilled, special teams were sent in to search homes and confiscate all produce, including planting seeds, as "fines" for unrealistically high quotas.

The Ukrainian countryside was cut off and became what Stalin called a "fortress." Starving farmers were prohibited from leaving their villages to search for food. Stealing a few stalks of wheat from the collective field was punished by death.





Supplies/Set-Up

- 1. Plastic mixing bowl
- 2. Saran wrap
- 3. A mug
- 4. String
- 5. Water
- 6. Hot desk lamp (to shine down on everything, like the Sun)
- 7. Modeling clay
- 8. 3 plastic lunch trays
- 9. 2 cups of soil (from a bag from the store; our Texas clay doesn't work so well!)
- 10. 1 quart bowl filled with mixture of leaves, grass, and small twigs
- 11. Water
- 12. Water Cycle Diagram

Introductory

- NATURAL, adjective [to be born or produced.] Pertaining to nature; produced or
 effected by nature, or by the laws of growth, formation or motion impressed on
 bodies or beings by divine power. Thus we speak of the natural growth of
 animals or plants; the natural motion of a gravitating body; natural strength or
 disposition; the natural heat of the body; natural color; natural beauty. In this
 sense, natural is opposed to artificial or acquired. (Noah Webster's 1828)
- 2. PHILOS'OPHY, noun [Latin philosophia; Gr. love, to love, and wisdom.]
 - a. Literally, the love of wisdom. But in modern acceptation, philosophy is a general term denoting an explanation of the reasons of things; or an investigation of the causes of all phenomena both of mind and of matter. When applied to any particular department of knowledge, it denotes the collection of general laws or principles under which all the subordinate phenomena or facts relating to that subject, are comprehended. Thus, that branch of philosophy which treats of God, etc. is called theology; that which treats of nature, is called physics or natural philosophy; that which treats of man is called logic and ethics, or moral philosophy; that which treats of the mind is called intellectual or mental philosophy or metaphysics.

The objects of philosophy are to ascertain facts or truth, and the causes of things or their phenomena; to enlarge our views of God and his works, and to render our knowledge of both practically useful and subservient to human happiness.

True religion and true philosophy must ultimately arrive at the same principle.

Lesson

- 1. We've been learning about the three phases of matter: gas, liquid, and solid. The gas that we have the most of here on earth is air. We learned about how much air is above and all around us, didn't we?
- 2. We've been learning about many of the properties of water, that make it so amazing, and that make it so critical to life on earth.
- 3. Now we'll learn about how God supplies us with fresh water.

Water Cycle Demonstration

- 1. Since water is critical to all life on earth, and we need *fresh* water all the time, the Lord designed a water recycling system; we call it the Water Cycle. First, we're going to get a demonstration going, so we can watch what happens while we do other stuff.
- 2. Place the mug in the bottom of the bowl, and add water to the bowl, til it comes 2/3rds of the way up the outside of the mug.
- 3. Cover the bowl tightly with saran wrap and secure with string.
- 4. Shine the light on it, and watch water. Say: Let's let it sit and see what will happen.
- 5. In the meantime, let's look at a diagram of the Water Cycle. (Show diagram, explain.
- 6. Keep an eye on your Demonstration, watch for water to condensate on the saran wrap, and even to drop down into the mug! Explain how that's like the oceans, clouds, rain, and land.
- 7. Show Water Cycle Diagram.

Erosion Demonstration—Janet van Cleave's Gooey, Slippery,... #137

- 1. This term, as we've studied Earth Science, we've been looking at the main things the earth is made of—air, water, and earth itself. The earth is the ground—the rocks, dirt, sand, etc. The land. The Latin word for earth is *terra*, which we translate as *land*.
- 2. As water goes through the water the Water Cycle, it interacts with the earth.
- 3. If the earth were millions and billions of years old, did you know that all of the continents would be under water by now? Erosion would have caused all of the highest mountains, bit by tiny bit, to have been carried into the sea, after only 400 million years. The earth is constantly eroding!

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
